


Angel Interfaith Network

A patient is in critical need - they have no food in the house, or no diapers for a newborn; no money for rent, or no access to social services; no friendly visits, or so many other crises - and Angel Interfaith Network responds immediately with services and genuine compassion. Such patients are recommended to AIN by a chaplain, social worker, or medical staff at LA County + USC Medical Center. AIN personally delivers available items to any home in Los Angeles County and does so as neighbors rather than as social administrators. Sometimes, grateful former patients call to offer their volunteer services. They see a sign of real connection when they equip people to help others. Angel Interfaith Network was co-founded in 1998 by the Rev. Ann Mills and Rev. Santos Romos, then chaplain at the hospital, and was housed here at Calvary for many years.

Calvary Youth Collective (CYC) is made up of 6th-12th graders from within and around Calvary Presbyterian Church in South Pasadena, CA. We meet every other week on Sunday afternoons from 12pm - 2pm.





CYC seeks to offer consistent opportunities for young people to learn, lead, and love through faith conversations, community engagement, service, leadership projects, games, and more.

The Youth Leadership Team (YLT) consists of 8th-12th graders who lead projects designed to serve the community and foster connections. These students work closely with adult partners from the church and wider community. We meet Sundays from 12 pm - 2 pm, alternating with CYC.





CROSSROADS WOMEN

The Mission of Crossroads, Inc. is to provide housing, education, support and counseling in a homelike environment for women who have been incarcerated. Our goal is to empower women to take control of their lives and to help them step out of the revolving door of prison and jail. Since July 1974, our services have been provided at no cost to women immediately upon their release from prison. Participation in the Crossroads program gives a woman the security of knowing that her basic needs are met and allows her to focus on acquiring new skills and tools for healthier living. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is the emergency and refugee program of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. The core budget, including staff and administrative costs, is funded through the One Great Hour of Sharing, and its program work is additionally funded through designated gifts. PDA enables congregations and mission partners of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A) to witness to the healing love of Christ through caring for communities adversely affected by crisis and catastrophic event. This year we will be donating towards the Hawai'i Wildfires as well as Israel/Palestine.

Habitat for Humanity





We have worked with Habitat for Humanity for 19 years in partnering with them to raise money for their builds through donations. From "Expanding the American Dream" to "Framing the Future". Habitat was hugely successful in their Expanding the American Dream campaign. They were ahead of schedule, and in October their 100th house was completed! Now they are on their *Framing the Future* campaign, which will build 200 homes throughout 31 communities over the next 3 years. They are starting their new campaign in January 2024, so our Mission Market proceeds will be a great way for them to start their campaign. The following are what they have planned for the Framing the Future campaign. **Bresee** - The first SB9 lot split project is underway in Baldwin Park. **Angeleno** - A fourplex is being built in Azusa, marking the first SGV Habitat new construction project in the city. **Stewart** - The first adaptive re-use project for our affiliate includes transforming a former church and school building into 16 opportunities for first-time homebuyers in the City of Baldwin Park. This is only possible through the partnership with Baldwin Park and the San **Gabriel Presbytery. El Sereno** - SGV Habitat was among a small list of organizations that have been awarded the opportunity to re-shape the landscape of El Sereno as they rehabilitate several homes, that have been sitting vacant for years, along what would have been the 710 corridor and build new homes on at least 4 vacant lots. **Torch** - This 12-unit development offering homeownership for first time home buyers is estimated to begin in fall of 2024. Lee - This future project in El Monte will offer opportunities for 4 families to achieve first time homeownership. In addition, there will also be a multitude of home repairs, a new ADU program, many workforce development partnerships, and a need for thousands of volunteers to join them.

Living Waters for the World

"We Believe all God's Children deserve clean water."

Jesus Christ is living water for our bodies and souls. For 30 years Living Waters for the World has shared clean water with over 1,000 communities across 26 countries including the USA. Today their ministry is focused on 11 networked regions including Appalachia, Cuba, Ghana, Honduras, Dominican Republic, Guatemala, Nicaragua, El Salvador Haiti, Peru and Yucatan Mexico.

Our San Gabriel Presbytery Team continues support work with our installations in Peru, and has begun to extend into Tijuana, Mexico where we will soon be installing a pure water system at Casa de Luz. The team installs water purification systems and trains community members to become self-reliant in continuing to provide clean water to their population. The many Calvary people who have traveled to Peru and now Tijuana can attest to the success of the systems and the longstanding relationships that keep the work meaningful for generations.

Ministry of Hope, Malawi Africa



Ministry of Hope was established in April 1999 by a young Malawian named Fletcher Matandika as a Christian response to the overwhelming number of orphans in Malawi.

It currently works through:

Community Centers: The 6 centers feed several thousand at risk children each day. While being fed physically they are also fed spiritually. The centers provide Bible training for children to help them establish a relationship with Jesus Christ.

Educational Support and Scholarships: Community centers provide nursery school for young children. Supplies and tutoring assistance for children are provided for children in primary school. A library and computer (solar powered) room, enhance learning opportunities. Scholarships are provided for youth to attend secondary school and college. A year of secondary school (high school) costs \$350.00 and one year of college is about \$900.00 (this includes books, supplies, uniforms, lodging and tuition).

Mobile Medical Clinics: A mobile medical clinic is provided to the communities that otherwise have limited access to medical care. The clinic is staffed by a Malawian medical director, physician assistants, nurses. On average the cost to assess and treat a patient is about \$3.

Crisis Nursery: Provides temporary care for babies who have been abandoned, whose mothers have died in childbirth or are in other life-threatening situations. The goal is to reunite babies with their extended families in the villages when the babies are old enough to eat solid food and no longer need intensive newborn care.



Sip N' Stitch has been a part of Calvary's mission work since 2008. They have made over 2,500 hand-made items and have shared their knitted items with many organizations in our community. This year they have added to the graduating seniors and foster kids from Reece Lemmon's school. They also give generously to Crossroads Women, Elizabeth House,

Door of Hope, Red Cross locally and new babies in our congregation....among others.

We are looking forward to seeing you at the Mission Market and are grateful for you to remember us with your time and finances.
